



Prince Road Planning

City of Tucson Department of
Transportation & Mobility staff met with
RBNA leaders to confirm that the
1980s proposal for Prince Road to
connect to a freeway on the other side
of the Rillito is no longer a plan.
Consequently, they propose to reduce
the existing 120 foot ROW to 80 feet.
There is no funding for the proposal,
nor a timeline. Many transportation
issues depend upon the outcome of
the City and RTA (Regional
Transportation Authority) resolving
priorities and the City's percentage of
participation in the region.

RillitoBend Priorities

- □ Track long-term planning for our portion of Prince Road to address landscaping, drainage, median/roadway enhancements, sidewalks, and bus shelters
- Meet with the "COMPLETE STREETS COORDINATING COUNCIL" for short-term funding opportunities

Plan Tucson – 2025

"Plan Tucson is a long-term plan which guides growth and development in the City by establishing our community's vision, goals, and policies. The plan's policies cover a wide range of elements, including environmental planning, cultural heritage, land use, transportation, parks, safety, public services, economic development, water resources, and housing. Plan Tucson is designed with a broad scope to address the diverse needs of the 242-square-mile City and the flexibility to respond to our rapidly changing environment during the document's 10-year planning horizon." RillitoBend Priorities

- ☐ <u>Aesthetic enhancement</u> for our streetscapes
- ☐ Roadway right-of-ways improvements for drainage, landscaping, pedestrian-bicycleequestrian-bus patron safety
- Utility infrastructure and transportation planning coordination with neighborhoods

<u>Impacts</u>: aesthetics; scale; lack of landscaping; visibility for vehicles turning; partial ADA access; lack of landscaping; no sidewalk connections; and poor planning coordination for the <u>six utility poles</u>

RBNA Meeting Minutes Saturday, May 17, 2025 5 PM to 6 PM

1. Welcome and Introductions

- 1.1. Attendance: Please see sign in sheet, approximately 28 individuals, the RBNA band members, and Marlene Avelino from Ward 3 office
- 1.2. New RBNA trifold brochure has been drafted thanks to Mary Bird. Purpose is to help engage neighbors and highlight various volunteer opportunities available. Feedback welcomed.

2. Treasurer's Report

2.1. Terry DeCarolis reported:

- Starting balance in February was \$2300.92
- Current balance is \$3482.95
- Income received thanks to RBNA Spring Arts and Music Festival donations and sale of merch.

3. Accomplishments and Challenges

- 3.1. Enhancements Estelle Stern-Eilers reported the following:
 - the presence of Maltese star thistle along Tucson Blvd near the stables and near the SE entrance to the park around some of the newly planted areas. Please keep an eye out for invasives.
 - the next Rio Vista Natural Resource Park volunteer planting workshop will be this Friday, May 23rd from 8-11am. Replacement of a few of the the recently planted native plants which did not survive and some weeding around the irrigation will take place.
 - the formation of the Rio Vista Stewards, and seeking volunteers, to help monitor the irrigation system in the park to ensure the new plants are supported.

3.2. Roads – Stephen Brigham reported the following:

- Plan Tucson: Comments on Plan Tucson were submitted to address priority issues for our neighborhood which are: A) Aesthetic Enhancement needs, B) attention to our street rights-of-ways, and C) coordination and planning of utility infrastructure
- Prince Road: The City has initiated planning to shift the designation of Prince Rd and rights-of-way alignment as part of a larger RTA suite of projects. This is an early phase of planning in support of future pedestrian and bike safety and landscape enhancements.

3.3. Other Items covered:

■ <u>Tucson Blvd</u>: A neighbor brought up the issue caused by the reclaimed water line break which flooded Tucson blvd and several adjacent properties. Limited repair work was done. A request to follow up with the City to complete the repair work was made.

- Country Club Rd: Pedestrian and bike safety concerns continue to be an issue. The short term solution may be installation of speed tables to help slow traffic. Marlena Avelino (Ward 3) mentioned there may be an opportunity to submit an application to Ward 3 after July 1 for assistance which would lower the cost per speed table to \$500/ea. Otherwise if we choose to self-fund, the cost is \$5000/ea.
- Shannon Park Apt streetside: Marlene Avelino (Ward 3) mentioned that David Marefka (COT DTM landscape architect) has a list of shallow rooted trees which may be an option where underground utilities may constrain tree planting options.
- 4. Discussion of what would neighbors like to see/share:
 - 4.1. Recycling bins requested for park by Kay M. Marlene Avelino mentioned that there are not bins due to a high contamination rate; she will keep looking into other options
 - 4.2. Glass recycling at park is often overflowing with glass on the ground. Marlene mentioned it is best to call 311 or the Ward 3 office directly, or submit using SeeClickFix.
 - 4.3. Stephen Brigham requested David Marefka (COT DTM landscape architect) to come and speak at the annual meeting on the opportunities and resources for planting along our rights-of-ways.
 - 4.4. Request for project and board member volunteers please contact a board member or Mike Shaw if interested
